#### Just breathe coping strategy

Well-being is a Strategic Priority in the Simcoe County District School Board, and our well-being department provides monthly strategies to support student and family well-being.

This month's strategy is deep breathing. Parents/guardians should practice deep breathing with their children to help them develop a deeper mind/body connection, self-regulation, awareness of emotions, and build resiliency. To practice deep breathing at home, have your child get comfortable by either standing or sitting. Encourage them to keep their back straight, and shoulders and head relaxed. If they're comfortable, ask them to close their eyes. Have your child place their hands flat on their stomach. Ask your child to breathe in deeply through their nose, filling the belly with breath. Point out how hands move out. Encourage them to hold their breath for a few seconds, then slowly breathe out through the mouth to feel the stomach contract and hands move in. Repeat 5-6 times.

Parents/guardians should practice deep belly breathing at home any time their child seems stressed or upset. Watch a deep breathing video here: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=le2TO\_MNFxE&t=3s</u>.

## Inclement weather and bus cancellation information reminder

All information regarding cancelled buses in Simcoe County is posted on the Simcoe County Student Transportation Consortium (SCSTC)'s bus information website at <u>www.simcoecountyschoolbus.ca</u>. <u>Our school is in the Central zone</u>. When buses are cancelled, schools remain open for student learning, unless otherwise noted. School staff are expected to plan for such emergencies in order to transition students who are unable to attend due to inclement weather, to their online platforms (Google Classroom and/or SCDSBhub [Brightspace by D2L]) and continue with academic programming. It is always a family decision whether or not it is safe for their child(ren) to leave for school under severe weather conditions.

The Consortium and bus operators try to make the decision to cancel school buses before 6 a.m. and make every effort to post announcements before 7 a.m. Inclement weather cancellations are effective for the whole day and buses cancelled in the morning will not run at the end of the day. ## Kindergarten registration for September 2023 is open!

Kindergarten is the beginning of a wonderful journey of learning, and we want your child to begin their journey in a SCDSB school! **Do you have a child who is turning four in 2023?** If so, we invite you to register your child for Kindergarten. To register online or for more information visit: <u>www.scdsb.on.ca/kindergarten</u>. **Junior Kindergarten students will start on Thursday September 7th.** 

Once you complete your registration, our Senior Administrative Support, Lindsay Sawyer will reach out to you with an email with instructions of what to do nest. Emails are sent out to new registrations at the beginning of each week. Before we can complete the registration process we need to view and confirm proof of birth (Birth Certificate or Passport) and Proof of Residency (i.e. Utility Bill) You can come to the front door of the school to show that during office hours.

Once we verify documentation we can complete the registration and prepare you for your students September start!

This session will explore practical, intentional, and fun ways to practice math facts at home. Participants will leave with ideas, games, and activities to support their child with becoming fluent with their math facts.
